The Disciple of Christ: Growing & Fruitful 2 Peter 1:3-8 Part B

- God has given us everything we need to have a spiritual life of power, godliness, and fruitfulness. vs. 3
- "And ye are complete in him, which is the head of all principality and power." Colossians 2:10
- As we learn to grow and walk in total faith in Jesus Christ, spiritual fruit is the natural outgrowth. Let's examine the fruit of a growing disciple of Jesus Christ.
- 1. First fruit: virtue. vs. 5
- 2. Second fruit: knowledge. vs. 5
- 3. Third fruit: temperance. vs. 6
- 4. Fourth fruit: patience. vs. 6
- 5. Fifth fruit: godliness. vs. 6
 - Godliness is a *love* and respect for the Lord that flows forth as a desire to live *holy* and serve Him.
 - When you're in a love relationship with someone, you want to please them.
 - You can have a *form* of godliness and miss the very essence of godliness, which is a love and affection for God.
 - "Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." 2 Timothy 3:5
 - True godliness comes from Christ within, not outward rules.

6. Sixth fruit: brotherly kindness. vs. 7

- God's plan is never for disciples to be an island to themselves. God created us in Christ to be in *fellowhsip* with other believers.
- "Always in every prayer of mine for you all making request with joy, For your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now." Philippians 1:4-5
- Disciples are in fellowship with other believers because they are *growing* in the fruit of brotherly kindness.
- "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another." Romans 12:10
- "But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another." 1 Thessalonians 4:9
- Brotherly kindness is a work of the Spirit.
- "Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently."
 1 Peter 1:22

7. Seventh fruit: charity. vs. 7

- Charity is a love to the whole human race, even your enemies and persecutors.
- "And the Lord make you to increase and abound in love one toward another, and toward all men, even as we do toward you." 1 Thessalonians 3:12
- "And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness." Colossians 3:14

These seven fruits begin from *within* (Christ in us) and abound outwardly. vs. 8
