Jesus is Crucified on the Cross

Mark 15: 25 - And it was the third hour, and they crucified him. (The third hour in Jewish time would have been 9 a.m.)

Jesus is Insulted and Mocked

The crowd

Matthew 27:39-40 - And they that passed by reviled him, wagging their heads, (40) And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross.

The leaders Mark 15:31 - The leading priests and teachers of religious law also mocked Jesus. "Likewise also the chief priests mocking said among themselves with the scribes, He saved others; himself he cannot save."

Jesus is Thirsty

John 19:28-29 - After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst. (29) Now there was set a vessel full of vinegar: and they filled a spunge with vinegar, and put it upon hyssop, and put it to his mouth.

It is Finished
