Making the Most of Your Christian Service

Colossians 1:26-29

Here in our text, the apostle Paul provides for us the answers as to how all believers can make the most of their Christian service. How can we “work smart” as we labor for the Lord?

As a local assembly of believers, we are on the same team, and we must advance the gospel of Jesus Christ. How will we get the job done? It will take team players with each one doing his or her part.

First, you must understand the _____. vs. 26

“*Mystery*” means “something that was kept secret.” It was hidden by God. But God has **now** revealed it.

God would set aside Israel’s prophetic program temporarily and would begin forming something altogether _____ – the body of Christ.

Gentiles would no longer have to go through Israel for divine blessing and acceptance. They could go straight to God through Jesus Christ.

There is no way to work smart and labor effectively for the Lord if you don’t understand the mystery revealed by God to Paul.

Second, you must labor under the right _____.
vs. 28

Paul preached Christ. This was his main business. Nobody preaches the _____ who doesn’t preach Christ first and foremost.

"For Christ sent me not to baptize, but to preach the gospel: not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of none effect. For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God." 1 Corinthians 1:17-18

What was Paul's goal in all of this? *"...that we may present every man perfect..."*

The word "perfect" means "fully _____." Paul's mission was to get people saved, but then bring the saints to full maturity in Christ.

Paul was given an "every man" ministry and mission.

"Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time." 1 Timothy 2:4-6

Third, you must be strengthened with all _____.
vs. 27, 29

We are brought into an intimate _____ and oneness with Christ at the very moment of salvation.

The entire foundation of Paul's work for God was Christ in Him. vs. 29

"I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20

Paul was not laboring in his own fleshly effort, but was relying on the power of Christ at work within him.

As we labor, it must be Christ in us, working in and through us. We must yield ourselves to Christ, and constantly acknowledge our _____ of Him.
