

Monday Night

More Than Conquerors "Overcoming Your Past and Laying Hold on Eternal Life"

1 Timothy 6: 11-16

God's desire for every person He saves is a changed life in Christ that is a reflection of His grace alone and serves as a testimony for His glory!

Paul challenges Timothy to "fight the good fight." This is not primarily a fight with external forces in our lives, but with the greatest challenge we face each day, our own flesh. vs. 12

This good fight is won by "laying hold on eternal life." That is, living life out of our understanding of the value of the life we have been given in Christ.

There are three principles that Paul spells out to Timothy in this passage that are the very foundation of a transformed life:

1.	The	princi	ole of	. vs. 11

The Christian life is first and foremost an exchanged life: our life for Christ's. We must live continually in this realization and act accordingly.

2. The principle of ______. vs. 13-14

The enduring example of the commitment we must demonstrate as disciples of Jesus Christ is seen in His example before Pilate.

3. The principle of . vs. 15-16

Ultimately, a changed life is motivated by the fact that one day we will stand in the presence of His holiness.

The most precious and valuable thing we possess as followers of Jesus Christ is the gift of eternal life. This is the life worth living; this is what we must lay hold on, if we are to experience God's transforming grace in our lives each day.

2 Corinthians 4:16-18

In this text, Paul tells us that he has found the secret to overcoming being hurt in the ministry, the secret to staying encouraged in the Lord.


1. The	Paul exerted. vs. 16a
	The word "faint" refers to "a failing of the heart." Paul is telling us, "We do not lose heart." Regardless of what comes his way, he does not give up, he does not give in.

	The "outer man" refers to the fleshly part of us. The word "perish" means "to rot, to ruin, to corrupt, or to be destroyed." This destruction of the "outer man" comes from two sources:
