- What started out as a normal day in the fishing business ended up being the day of Peter's salvation! Peter got caught in God's net. There isn't a \_\_\_\_\_ place to be!
- To get caught in God's net means that you are God's child, you have eternal life and forgiveness of all your sins.
- How does a person get caught in God's net?

First, you must be confronted by God's \_\_\_\_\_. vs. 1-3

- Before fish can be caught, they must be sought.
- In the same way, if a person becomes a child of God, it is because somebody cared enough to \_\_\_\_\_ out to them and share God's good news with them.
