First, because he	had a testimony of

- He not only had a faithful testimony with God, but he also had a faithful testimony with ______. He had a "good report" of all the Jews in the area of Damascus.
- God rewards great faithfulness with great privilege.
- "Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful." 1 Corinthians 4:2
- "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much. If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches? And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own?" Luke 16:10-12
- Every person can be faithful. Yet very _____ are faithful.

•	God to us through His written and completed Word.	
•	You must be in His Word and have a tender heart to receive His Word.	
•	The opposite of a tender heart would be a cold, hard heart. Hebrews 3:7-12, 15-19	
	rd, because his desire to God was onger than his fears – vs. 13-17a	
•	When you serve God and seek to obey God, sometimes it can be scary. God's way is not always the "" way, or "easy" way.	
•	If we want God to trust us with great privilege, we have to have a burning desire and thirst to obey God. Acts 5:17-18, 28-29, 40-42	
•	What privilege this man Ananias had! But it didn't happen by, or chance, or through a random choice of God. It happened because he was faithful, tender-hearted, and obedient.
