Are We So Different?

Why is it a problem to think we are so different from others?

Something in our nature makes us want to believe we are <u>better</u> than others. Soon we begin to feel that some people don't <u>deserve</u> God's grace. The truth is that <u>none</u> of us deserve God's grace.

So, what is the proper way to view our differences?

Cultures can be different, without one being *superior*.

"For who maketh thee to differ from another? and what hast thou that thou didst not receive? now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received it?" **1 Corinthians 4:7**

- All that we have, including our national *identity* came from God.
- Only God should receive **<u>glory</u>** for what He has given.
- Pride can cause us to have a distorted <u>view</u> of the world for whom Jesus died.

Nations are different, but in <u>Christ</u> we are one.

"...And put no difference between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith." Acts 15:9

- Peter points out that it was God who revealed that there was really no difference between the Jew and Gentile in regards to <u>salvation</u>.
- Members of the body differ by gifts and roles, not by *nationality*.
- No one in the church is more *valuable* than any other.

People can seem different, but we are <u>all</u> the same before God.

"What then? are we better than they? No, in no wise: for we have before proved both Jews and Gentiles, that they are all under sin." **Romans 3:9**

- The Jews had <u>advantages</u> over the Gentiles, but they were not superior.
- The Jews were tempted to believe their religious past gave them special *privileges* before God.

Islam is a religion that seems very different, yet is much like many other religions.

- It often tries to conform others to its <u>rules</u>.
- Its adherents look for ways to gain more of God's favor through their <u>efforts</u>.
- Its followers are left empty, devoid of the <u>*Truth*</u>, longing for something real and meaningful in their lives.

Paul, in writing to the Corinthians (2 Corinthians 2:14, 15), mentions only two kinds of people in the world:

- Those who are <u>saved</u>.
- Those that *perish*.

The only <u>eternal</u> difference is whether we have received or rejected the <u>gift</u> of eternal life through Christ.

<u>Missions</u> helps us view the world in the light of God's Word, and realize that, despite our <u>cultural</u> differences, we can enjoy our union together in Christ, both now and in the <u>ages</u> to come.

"...and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation." **Revelation 5:9**
