•	 The moment you call upon Jesus to save you, you are set apa or sanctified in Christ Jesus. 1 Corinthians 1:2, 30 		
•	If you have never been sanctified in Christ, this means that you are still in your sins.

•	God's will is for you to live out in your daily who He has made you in Christ. 1 Thessalonians 4:3-5		
•	God's plan is for the sanctified believer to a sanctified life.
