- "That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life." Titus 3:7
- 4. Faith, love, and hope: these are the fruits that Paul looked for in the churches that gave evidence of true salvation.

## Verse 6-7

1.	Notice that our mission field is the vs. 6			
	<ul> <li>Paul had an "all men," "every nation" ministry, and fulfilled it</li> </ul>			
	faithfully. 1:28			
2.	Paul had learned the secret of through other faithful men (like			
	Epaphras) and shared that spiritual secret with Timothy.			
	<ul> <li>"And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses,</li> </ul>			
	the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach			
	others also." 2 Timothy 2:2			
3.	The gospel had brought forth fruit in these Colossians. In other words, it			
	had their lives.			
4.	Notice the progression that happened in order for them to bear that			
	spiritual fruit:			
	• First, they the gospel. vs. 6			
	Second, they the gospel. vs. 7			
	Third, they the gospel. vs. 6			
5.	Paul defines the gospel in verse 6 as, "the grace of God in truth."			
Ver	se 8			
1.	When Epaphras journeyed to Rome and visited Paul, he told Paul of all			
	the great in this Colossian church. Remember, this is an			
	evidence of true salvation.			
2.	Paul identified where this love was coming from. They were loving "in the			
	Spirit."			

- 3. Galatians 5:22 says, "the fruit of the Spirit is love."
  - Before salvation, it is unnatural to love \_\_\_\_\_ people. Titus 3:3
  - But, at salvation, the Holy Spirit comes to indwell believers and lead them into a life of love. God's Spirit \_\_\_\_\_ us to love.
  - "He therefore that despiseth, despiseth not man, but God, who hath also given unto us his holy Spirit. But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another." 1 Thessalonians 4:8-9
