## Galatians Chapter 3

## Verse 8

- 1. This verse teaches that Abraham had the gospel preached unto him.
- 2. Remember, "gospel" simply means "good news." What was the good news that Abraham received?
  - "In thee shall all...nations...be blessed."
- 3. In order for this to happen, it would require Abraham and Sarah to have a son. They had never been able to have children and now they were old and well stricken in years.
  - So the good news to Abraham centered around a promised son Isaac.
- 4. M.R. DeHaan put it this way:
  - "God asked him to believe in a long-promised son, a long-delayed son, a miraculously born, a supernaturally given son. God asked Abram to believe the humanly impossible, the naturally unreasonable, and the miraculously supernatural." (*Galatians* page 90)
- 5. Abraham believed God concerning this promised son and God imputed righteousness to him. Abraham was saved by simply placing his faith and trust in God's Word and God's promise.
- 6. The Scripture foresaw the day when God would offer justification to every individual in every heathen nation through faith alone.
- 7. Just like Abraham, their faith would center around a Son, a long-awaited, long-promised Son, Jesus Christ. Paul brings out this parallel in **Romans 4:18-25**.
  - Righteousness was imputed to Abraham because of his faith in God's promise.
  - Verses 23 and 24 state, "Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was imputed to him; but for us also..."
  - The moment we place our faith in Jesus Christ, righteousness is imputed unto us!
- 8. Let us make one thing clear: Galatians 3:8 did not say that the Scripture **foretold** that God would justify the heathen through faith. It says, "And the Scripture **foreseeing**..."
  - This marvelous dispensation of grace that we enjoy was kept secret since the world began, hidden from ages and from generations. **Ephesians 3:3-5; Colossians 1:25-26**

## Verse 9

- 1. Abraham is the example of saving faith. He was a type or picture of believers today.
  - He placed his faith in God's promise concerning a promised son Isaac (a type or picture of Jesus Christ.)
  - As a result of his faith, righteousness was imputed to him by God.
- 2. When people today place their faith in God's Son, Jesus Christ, they, too, are blessed as Abraham was blessed righteousness is imputed unto them by faith alone.
  - 2 Corinthians 5:21

3. This is why this verse says, "So then they which be of faith are blessed with faithful Abraham."

## **Verse 10-12**

- 1. Paul will now contrast faith and the law.
  - Those which are of faith are blessed. vs. 9
  - Those which are of the works of the law are **cursed. vs.10**
- 2. Paul quotes **Deuteronomy 27:26** which pronounces a curse upon any person who does not continue in **all things** of the law.
- 3. The law reveals the perfect righteousness of a holy God. It is described as holy, just, good, and spiritual. **Romans 7:12-14**
- 4. In order to achieve righteousness through the law, one would have to keep the law in totality and continuance his/her entire lifetime. It demands obedience in all things (no exceptions).
  - This is the idea of verse 12 when it says, "The man that doeth them shall live in them."
- 5. Life can only come to those who keep the law in perfection. But to offend the law in one point (James 2:10) is to offend the righteousness of a holy God and the penalty is death. 1 John 3:4; cf. Romans 6:23
  - **Illustration:** how many links must you break in a chain to break the chain? Just one.
  - How many lies do you have to tell to be a liar? Just one.
  - How many sins do you have to commit to be a sinner? Just one.
- 6. This is why Paul said in **Romans 7:10**, "And the commandment, which was ordained to life, I found to be unto death." The law was the tool that sin used to slay and kill Paul, spiritually speaking. **Romans 7:11**
- 7. Nobody can look the law in the eye and claim perfection; therefore it is evident that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God (vs. 11). The law reveals our guilt (Romans 3:19) and leaves us in debt to a holy God. Romans 4:4
- 8. Then how can anyone be saved? "The just shall live by faith."
- 9. Righteousness and life are possible, but not through doing the law, but by simply believing God. Remember the example of Abraham in verses 6-9:
  - Abraham believed God and it was accounted to him for righteousness. vs. 6
  - They which are of **faith** are the children of Abraham. **vs. 7**
  - God justifies the heathen through **faith**. vs. 8
  - They which are of **faith** are blessed with faithful Abraham. vs. 9
- 10. The law is not of faith (vs. 12). The law is not about believing, but doing.
  - Many people are steeped in a religion of "doing."
  - The Bible says that they are under a curse.
  - Satan has deceived so many people. They believe that God will bless them on Judgment Day because of what they have done. **Matthew 7:21-22** gives a vivid and frightening description.
  - In reality they will be cursed and they will hear, "I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity." Matthew 7:23
