Unconditional _____ - 18:4

- *“For the love of Christ constraineth us; because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead: And that he died for all, that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again.” 2 Corinthians 5:14-15*

Unconditional _____ - 19:1-7

- *“For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed.”* **Romans 10:11**
