- But, the good news is that every believer can overcome temptation.
- In our text, David encounters incredible temptation.
- How did David overcome such incredible temptation to sin?

First, David refused to allow the sin of to influence him to sin. vs. 1-5

 "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord... Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good."
 Romans 12:19, 21

Second, David refused to allow _____to influence him to sin. vs. 6-8

- "My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not."
 Proverbs 1:10
- "And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them."

Ephesians 5:11

 You will give account to God, not your friends, for your choices.
Third, David refused to allowto influence him to sin. vs. 9-12
 David wasn't going to make an emotional decision based on circumstances; his decision would be based upon God's Word.
 Don't ever interpret a circumstance as a divine "okay" to You will always regret it later.
Fourth, David totally in the Lord. vs. 13-25
He knew he didn't need to take matters into his own hands. He could leave it with the Lord, and God was and trustworthy.
