   Corinthians 5:21
- "Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed."
   1 Peter 2:24

<ul> <li>"For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."</li> <li>Romans 5:6, 8</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>The cross clearly demonstrates two things about God:</li> </ul>
<ul><li>God hates</li></ul>
<ul><li>God loves!</li></ul>
Second, Christ alone has defeated vs. 22-26
<ul> <li>What does this mean for us? When we!</li> <li>Him, we live forever, too! We get His!</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>"And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand." John 10:28</li> </ul>
