**First, because Christ gave His life \_\_\_\_\_ you.  
John 10:11-15**

- *“I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.” **John 10:11***
- *“For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.” **Romans 5:6, 8***

**Second, because Christ gives His life \_\_\_\_\_ you.**

- As the good shepherd, He died for us, but as the \_\_\_\_\_ shepherd, He rose from the dead.  
Hebrews 13:20
- When you come to Jesus in faith, you actually receive Christ's resurrection \_\_\_\_\_ the moment you believe on Him. Romans 8:9-11

**Third, because Christ will live His life \_\_\_\_\_ you.**

- Christ gave His life \_\_\_\_\_ you so that He could give His life \_\_\_\_\_ you in order that He might live His life \_\_\_\_\_ you.
- *"I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me."* **Galatians 2:20**
