

- Paul's message content to the Athenians was different than the messages he had preached previously in the synagogues.
- The Athenians were idolatrous pagans without any basic understanding of the Scriptures.
- Webster's defines a pagan as "one who has little or no religion and who delights in sensual pleasures and material goods."
- How do you witness to a person that has <u>no</u> biblical background or understanding of God or of Christ?
- Paul's message will provide the framework for us. We must seek to help them understand:
