	and proved us Romans 3:19-20	
4.	Christ them out when He died on the cross. This means "	to
	smear out; to obliterate."	
5.	Keeping a set of and laws is no longer an issue in gaining	j a
	righteous standing before a holy God. Romans 3:21-22, 28	
6.	How can this be? How can a holy God justify people who have fallen s	hor
	of His righteous standards? He can do it based on what Christ did on t	he
	cross.	
7.	Christ kept the law in totality and then took it and it to His	
	cross. He took it out of the way.	
8.	Christ nailed the law to the cross, thereby forever dealing with the	
	issue.	
	If there was any of God's law that Christ did not na	il to
	the cross, then that means that it still has life and power to	
	condemn us. No, Christ took it all out of the way.	

9.	Any religious group that wants to hold all or part of the Old Testament law
	as a standard for acceptance with God is a religion that has
	failed to understand the cross work of Christ.
	"For I through the law am dead to the law, that I might live unto
	God." Galatians 2:19
