	<ul> <li>God's hand (power) was upon them as they preached.</li> <li>vs. 21a</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Many lost people believed the gospel and to the Lord. vs. 21b</li> </ul>
•	This is God's plan for any church: Exalt Jesus Christ and His finished work, and teach God's Word.
•	If a church does not have this as its foundation, it will not God.
