	that would help a believer to show forth Christ whether he found himself a
	servant or free.

3.	If you are a servant, serve with a right attitude and a right work ethic, as if

•	Paul gets to the very root of the issue by dealing with the overriding issues
	of love, grace, patience, kindness, etc. Here are some of the doctrines tha
	Paul taught that would greatly impact the way a person thought about servanthood:
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1.	Paul taught that there are no social distinctions in the body of Christ.
