Verse 8-9

1.	The scope and impact of these verses are absolutely enormous. Paul makes a
	huge statement that is one of the greatest compliments that he could ever give to a
	church.
2.	In his travels, Paul had no need to tell others of what God had done in
	Thessalonica. Why is this?
	Because they had personally been out the Word of the Lord.
	Because their to God had been spread abroad.
3.	Paul says that they had "turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God."
	This is a great verse that demonstrates what Gentile is in
	this dispensation of grace today.
	Their faith laid in idols previously, but they (to think)
	differently) and believed Paul's gospel. We see this same thing over and over
	again. Acts 11:21, 14:15, 15:19, 20:21, 26:18
4.	Paul's gospel was that:
	Christ dealt fully with the issue on the cross. He made a full and
	complete payment for the sins of all of mankind on the cross.
	→ "To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not
	imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word
	of reconciliation." 2 Corinthians 5:19
	He then called upon people to from any preconceived ideas,
	religious rituals, or idolatrous practices that they were trusting in, and turn to the
	living God and trust His Son alone for salvation and forgiveness.
5.	Faith in Christ not only brings salvation, it also brings new direction and
	into our lives. The Thessalonians no longer served the idols that
	they used to trust in. They now served the living and true God. vs. 9

Not of works, lest any man should boast.

	clouds and to catch away all those who are in Christ. 4:16-17
3.	There are three facts contained in this little verse:
	Christ is raised from the dead and has ascended to heaven.
	Christ is for believers.
	His return means a deliverance from the to come.
4.	As we serve the Lord, we serve Him in anticipation that this time of grace that we
	are living in could come to an at any moment.
5.	We must fervently serve the Lord (Romans 12:11) and redeem the time

(Ephesians 5:16), all the while "Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious

appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ." Titus 2:13
