# 1 Thessalonians Chapter 2

#### Verse 14

- 1. The Thessalonians had experienced some rough waters since they trusted Christ as their Savior. 1:6, 3:3-4
- 2. They had endured some \_\_\_\_\_\_ from their own countrymen.
- 3. Satan hates baby Christians and actively seeks to \_\_\_\_\_\_ them right after salvation. What the Thessalonians experienced is not at all unusual.
- 4. This is why every new believer needs a spiritual \_\_\_\_\_\_ who has been there and can reassure him/her when problems come.

### Verse 15-16

- 1. These two verses give us a vivid description of the nation of Israel during the book of Acts. It can be summed up with the words, *"…they please not God."*
- Not only did they want nothing to do with the good news of Christ, but they didn't want the Gentiles to have an opportunity to \_\_\_\_\_\_ and receive it either. Acts 13:16-52, 14:1-19, 17:1-14
- The phrase "come upon" denotes anticipation. Paul was anticipating the full
   \_\_\_\_\_\_ of God to be unleashed upon Israel. The wrath of God has been
   temporarily withheld from this earth, but when this dispensation of
   \_\_\_\_\_\_
  is over, the wrath will commence.

## Verse 17-18

- 1. Paul wanted so much to see these dear friends again. In fact, Paul had started to return to Thessalonica many times, but it never worked out.
- 2. Why couldn't Paul get there? Verse 18 states, "...but \_\_\_\_\_ hindered us."
- 3. Satan is a real, living, spirit being that is actively seeking to \_\_\_\_\_\_ the cause of Christ on this earth.
  - "Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil." Ephesians 6:11

- 4. While we should recognize the reality of Satan, we need not \_\_\_\_\_\_ him.
  - *"For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."* **2 Timothy 1:7**
- We can stand against the wiles of Satan and we can quench the fiery darts of the wicked, but it will only happen as we walk by \_\_\_\_\_\_ in God's Word and \_\_\_\_\_\_ diligently. 3:10; Ephesians 6:16-18

#### Verse 19-20

- Like chapter one, this chapter ends with a reference to Christ's coming. In fact,
   \_\_\_\_\_ chapter in this book ends with a reference to Christ's coming.
- 2. As Paul anticipated and looked forward to the coming of Jesus, Paul states that these people would be his \_\_\_\_\_\_ and crown of rejoicing in heaven.
- Here is the clear teaching: at the coming of Jesus, our joy will be the \_\_\_\_\_\_
   that we have led to Christ and impacted for Christ.
- 4. Christian, make sure that you are investing your time, talents, and abilities in things that really matter eternally. What really matters eternally? \_\_\_\_\_!
