2.	How could Paul keep such a positive mindset during deep trials
	(2 Corinthians 4:8-12)? He refused to focus on the temporal, but rather
	focused on the 2 Corinthians 4:16-18
Verse 19-21	
1.	I have grouped these three verses together because they all go hand in hand
	in the context of the passage.
2.	Paul wrote the book of 1 Thessalonians during the Acts time period, when he
	was still traveling. It is one of Paul's earliest books.
3.	During this time period when God's Word was incomplete, it was necessary for
	God's truth to be dispensed to the churches, and they had to be constantly
	brought up to speed with truth as God revealed it.
4.	There would be people in the church with the gift of The Holy
	Spirit would reveal to them His truth and they, in turn, would proclaim it to the
	church body.
5.	During these days when truth was being dispensed, a person could quench
	the Spirit by despising the prophesying of another brother.
	• But, if a man said, "Thus saith the Lord," were they to automatically believe
	him?
3.	Paul said that the church was to all things.
	To "prove" simply means "to"

  - "If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord."
