	manufacture on his They are a natural expression of God's Spirit
	filling a yielded believer.
C.	There are nine graces that constitute the fruit of the Spirit:
	• Love
	ightarrow This is listed first because the other fruit flows forth from the fruit
	of love. Colossians 3:14; Galatians 5:14
	• Joy
	ightarrow This is a joy that comes from the Holy Spirit within. Romans 14:17,
	15:13
	→ This fruit of joy has nothing whatsoever to do with
	circumstances. 2 Corinthians 7:4, 8:2
	 "And ye became followers of us, and of the Lord, having received the
	word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Ghost."
	1 Thessalonians 1:6
	 "Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye
	are in heaviness through manifold temptations:
	That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold
	that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise
	and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:
	Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him
	not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory."

	peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I
	have overcome the world." John 16:33
	ightarrow When the world is like a hurricane all around you, the Christian's heart
	can be like the eye of the storm. This is called the of God.

•	Longsuffering
	ightarrow It is used two different ways in the New Testament.
	ightarrow Sometimes it carries the idea of patiently enduring through
	2 Corinthians 6:4-6; James 5:10
	ightarrow Other times it has to do with patiently enduring
	Ephesians 4:2; Colossians 3:12-13
	ightarrow Longsuffering would be the opposite of being soon
