	the Lord Jesus Christ.
B.	To Paul, the cross was not an or picture. It was a reality. When
	Paul refers to the cross, he is referring to the finished work of
	that was accomplished on the cross.
C.	The "by whom" makes clear that Paul is referring to the of the
	cross, not a physical emblem to be revered, worshipped, or admired.
D.	Paul says, "by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world."
E.	"The world" speaks of the world system that is operative on the
	earth today.
F.	As believers in Christ, God's Spirit has placed us into Christ, and we are no
	longer part of this system. Galatians 1:4; Colossians 1:13-14
